As many of you know we have been preparing to launch a parish wide capital campaign to raise funds to build a new Parish Center. Well, the time has come! We received final approval from the diocese to move forward with the building project so today I am announcing the start of our parish campaign called "Our Campaign for Tomorrow". Our goal is to raise a minimum of \$500,000.

With the assistance of Greater Mission, a Catholic fund-raising firm we are moving forward with the campaign. It will move through several phases beginning with a Leadership phase, moving to Gathering and Participation phases. Every household in our parish and some beyond will be asked for their support and to participate in a gathering. The campaign will be based in prayer and asking for everyone's best sacrifice. Since we are asking for a best sacrifice, through the intercession of the Holy Spirit, all gifts will be confidential as the best sacrifice for every household is different.

We will keep everyone informed about the progress in each phase and when you are invited to participate in a gathering at someone's home or here at the parish, we hope you will make every effort to attend. I cannot do this alone and have reached to a small group of parishioners to serve as a Campaign Cabinet, but even with their help, it is your help, participation and generosity that will help us reach our goal.



Letter to the Community of St. Elizabeth Catholic Church regarding our Social Ministry:

To the Fellowship at St. Elizabeth's Catholic Church,

My name is Libbie Baggan. I was struggling this time last year. I lost my job in July 2023 and was without any income for 3 months. I was starving and didn't know how I'd be able to come up with the remaining \$687 I owed my landlord for rent October 2023. I reached out to St. Elizabeth's for help.

Ms. Morton met with me at the library one afternoon in late September 2023. I shared with her a portion of my story and the difficult situation I found myself in. She hugged me as I wept and let me know that St. Elizabeth's would donate the amount, I still owed my landlord, and she gave me a \$25 gift card to Walmart too so I could buy myself groceries! That night was the first night in months I did not go to bed hungry, and the weight of my fear of impending eviction was lifted from me.

I am doing much better these days. I wanted to give back the help that was so freely given to me when I had nowhere else to turn, plus a small donation. God showed his love to me through your ministry. I know I am going to remember it for the rest of my life.



Our Campaign for Tomorrow



St. Elizabeth-Richmond Campaign Goal: \$500,000

Together, We Make A Difference

As Catholics, we have a responsibility to meet the needs of our parish and to act collectively for the benefit of us all. The generations before us have given us a great heritage and now it is our time to add to that heritage. *Our Campaign for Tomorrow* is being conducted to provide funds to construct a new Parish Center that our parish truly needs.

The \$500,000 goal is designed to provide the resources we need along with others to make this project a reality. Connected to the church and handicapped accessible, the new Parish Center will provide meeting space for ministry groups, classrooms for our growing religious education program, and offices for our staff.

In the coming weeks, we will be sharing more information with you during Mass, in the bulletin, at receptions, and in information packets for each family. As our parish moves forward, each of us is asked to do three things:

• Listen and Learn. Come to understand the needs of our parish in a very detailed way. See the impact of what the funds raised will do.

• **Reflect and Pray.** Consider all that will be accomplished and the importance of the Church in your life. As a family, seek God's guidance as to how you can best help. Ask questions and ensure your understanding during this period.

• **Decide and Act.** When you feel you have had your questions answered and can determine how best you can assist, please make your pledge and celebrate with our entire parish family.

In the coming weeks, we will build on this information and look forward to an active dialogue with you. Thank you for your prayers, consideration, and interest in our parish.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why is the parish conducting this campaign?

With the addition of new families, many of them with children, we have simply outgrown our current facilities. Our offices are inadequate, and we have no dedicated meeting space for our ministry groups. This facility is long overdue.

The Parish Center will cost much more than \$500,000. How can it be built?

That is true. We need a total of \$1.5 to \$2 million to complete the project. What is also true is that we are a small parish, and it is unlikely we can raise all these funds. We have already received significant commitments from friends of the parish, we have parish savings, and we intend on selling the current parish office building. All of this, with your generous support, will provide what we need to complete the new building.

Is the Diocese of Richmond supporting our efforts?

Yes, 100% of the funds that we raise in this campaign will remain in the parish and will not be subject to any diocesan assessments. Bishop Knestout has been very supportive and has recently given final approval for the project.

How will I be asked to participate?

Every household in the parish will be invited to attend either a home gathering or a gathering here at the Church between December 2024 and February 2025. If you cannot attend a gathering, we will then conduct Witness Weekends in late January/early February and a Participation Weekend in late February so that all will have ample time to pray and reflect on your gift.

Who is being asked to participate?

Every registered family in the parish as well as all who join us regularly will be asked to prayerfully consider a gift to the campaign. We are a small parish, so it is extremely important that we receive a high rate of participation for our campaign to be able to reach our goal. There are many local community members who will also be asked to help us with a gift.

Is my gift confidential?

Yes, the gift packet you receive will be personal to you and your family and will not be shared with any other member of the parish community. There will be no parishioner-to-parishioner solicitation; your gift is entirely between you and the Lord.

How much should I give?

Each household will be asked for a gift in a gift range, not a specific amount. You will be asked to give this your prayerful consideration and make a **Decision of Faith** based on the spiritual principles that we should give out of **Gratitude** for the gifts God has given us, out of **Joy** rather than obligation, and finally out of **Love**, as Christ showed His Selfless Love for all of us.

How will I be reminded about my payments?

There is going to be a way to make your gift online via WE SHARE which will eliminate the need for reminders. That link will be provided to you but we ask that you not use it until you have received your packet and have had time to pray about your best sacrifice. The parish will send regular pledge payment reminders based on the frequency you request (Monthly, Quarterly, etc.) for those who choose not to use WE SHARE. In addition, for those who use offertory envelopes, payment envelopes will be placed in the offertory envelope packets.

How long is the pledge period and when will I receive my first pledge reminder?

Pledges can be made over a 3 to 5-year period, and parishioners may choose the month in which to start payment and choose whether to receive monthly, quarterly, or annual reminders. Pledge reminders will begin to be mailed in March 2025 to those who need them.
